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



Use the notes already given as a guide, and try to make use of some triplet groups. Be sure that each bar equals the correct number of beats. Have fun!







Col legno – Playing with the wooden (stick) part of the bow.
Sul tasto – Play over the fingerboard. Ponticello –Play on or near the bridge.
Non pont. – No longer play on or near the bridge.
Tremolo J = Repeat the note as fast as possible for the note's full duration.
A tempo – Return to the original speed. Sul E – Play entirely on the E string.
Gliss. (glissando) – Slide your finger to the next note.


