

mf-f and f-ff - Play the louder dynamic when repeating the piece.



Tenuto – Hold a note for its full value.






With 'Improvising fun!' you can play whatever you feel like playing for the bars that have been marked '(Impro.)'.












Col legno – Playing with the wooden (stick) part of the bow.
Sul tasto – Play over the fingerboard. Ponticello –Play on or near the bridge.
Non pont. – No longer play on or near the bridge.
Tremolo ♀ – Repeat the note as fast as possible for the note's full duration.
A tempo – Return to the original speed. Sul G – Play entirely on the G string.
Gliss. (glissando) – Slide your finger to the next note.




